March was Women's History month and what better time to memorialize a wonderful woman than by re-enacting her speech on December 7, 1941. Even before the president could speak to the country, she used her regular radio broadcast to prepare the nation for the trials to come. Members of the Drama Reading Group did this very absorbing enactment: Grace Agardy, Mary Ashley, Pat Field, Jeri Foley, Carol Hansen and Scotty Martinson.

Business was conducted and the budget was approved by voice vote.

No slate of officer nominees was available and Barbara Bowden and others commented on the lack of members to do the job of organizing events such as the History Month luncheon. A drastically pared down branch was forecast, but even that requires at least a small leadership team to be recognized by state and national AAUW.

<u>NoViolet Bulawayo</u> will discuss her novel, which is based on her childhood in Zimbabwe and her transition to U.S. life: *"We Need New Names"*.

<u>M.P. Cooley</u> has written a mystery set in upstate New York. June Lyons is a police detective and single parent who is the protagonist of "*Ice Shear*" and "*Flame Out*".

Elizabeth Rosner repeats as an authors' lunch panelist. In addition to "Blue Nude" and "Speed of Light" she has recently published "Electric City" set in the (GE) company town of Schenectady N.Y.

Our fourth author, NASA scientist <u>Azadeh</u> <u>Tabazadeh</u>, brings insight into the lives of Iranians who saw no good in the regimes of either the Shah or the Ayatollah. Fearing that their son will be forced to fight in the Iran-Iraq was, her parents paid a former drug smuggler to take both Azadeh and her brother out of Iran. Her memoir's title "*Sky Detective*" reflects her lifelong-interest in the science of clouds.

Mystery writer, <u>Heather Haven</u> will moderate the discussion.
