Board Meeting August 5, 2016

The following are excerpts from minutes of the August 5 board meeting as prepared by Barbara Bowden, edited for space reasons.

Membership: Mary Morrison reported that there are several members of long standing who have not paid their current year's dues. The list was passed around and board members agreed to call those with whom they have a relationship. Dues for a member of long standing who is currently dealing with multiple challenges will be paid from the branch dues assistance fund.

Tech Trek: the board agreed that we should send six campers in 2017, which will essentially use most of our accumulated funds in the account.

We plan to invite the 2016 Tech Trek participants and a parent to our Saturday, November 12 potluck luncheon.

The board discussed the issues Anna Zara dealt with in trying to work through the school district to contact science and math teachers in EPA schools; it was suggested that approaching the individual teachers might be effective as an alternative.

The program schedule was reviewed. The next general meeting is on Sunday, September 25, 1:30 – 3:30 in the Embarcadero Room of the Rinconada Library.

The Holiday Giving Event will take place in the 10th floor lounge at Channing House on Saturday, December 10 from 2 – 4. Bowden will check with Tempe Javitz to see if she still wants young adult books for the Girls to Women Group in EPA.

Equal Pay Day: no specific action planned at this time. Mary Morrison reminded us that

the San Jose Branch has an active program at their community colleges, Start Smart to Work Smart, to reach women entering the job market for the first time, as well as those who are already employed. It was suggested that we contact Foothill College about presenting the program; Mary Morrison is a qualified instructor.

Claire Noonan, Los Altos Branch, is encouraging active support for a Strong Start initiative, a coalition of many groups working toward more and better early childhood education, ages 3-8. It was determined that we should wait for a public policy review from AAUW CA, since do not have a clear picture of the group's plan for future action.

Judy Brodsky will be our representative to the IBC for the 2016 – 2017 year. Marcia Baugh offered to attend the September 26 meeting with Judy.
