The meeting was a good opportunity to collaborate and learn from each other and from the camp directors.

AAUW Interbranch Council (IBC)

The seven AAUW branches in Santa Clara County send a representative to four IBC meetings each year to discuss the branches' mutual goals and concerns. Mary Morrison is Palo Alto branch's current representative at the IBC.

All seven of the branches sponsor girls at the Tech Trek program at Stanford. At IBC all of the branches share the ways they are supporting AAUW's goals.

However, this is a special year as the branches are gearing up to celebrate the 100th anniversary of women's suffrage. The amendment giving women the right to vote was ratified on August 18, 1920. AAUW in Santa Clara County and the county's Office of Women's Policy are co-chairing a *Centennial Celebration Work Group*. 
